The framework has been divided into two workstreams: Construction and Consultancy.

- **Construction** - divided into lots by region and project size
- **Consultancy** - will support projects from initial project feasibility, through to project delivery.

The Construction workstream allows for the development of all types of new build residential accommodation including:

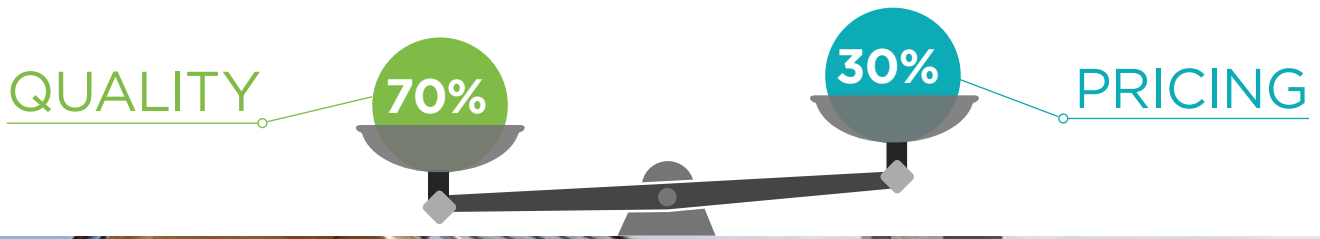
